



Centralised Match for Advanced Training Positions in 2023 update 25/5/22

The Centralised Match will open on 1st June. This match is for continuing Advanced Trainees. New Advanced Trainees are eligible to participate in the second-round match.

Applications for the first-round match close on 22nd June. Do not leave your application to the last minute.

To register for the match

- go to the PMCV website after it opens on 1st June
- upload your CV
- nominate 3 referees. Make sure you have spoken to your referees before you nominate them and ensure that they will be available to complete your referee's report before 22nd June.
- nominate your preferred Health Services. Only Health Services that you have nominated will be able to see your details, CV and referee's reports. They will not be able to see your preference list.
- You may add additional Health Services to your list until 22nd June
- You will be able to re-order and remove Health Services from your list until 14th July, but not add additional Health Services.
- You may withdraw from the match until 14th July, following which the results of the match are binding.

Submit your application for employment with your preferred Health Services.

- you cannot be matched unless you have applied to the Health Service and included it on your match preference list
- note that deadlines for applications may vary between health services
- there is no single interview panel for the centralised match. Each Health Service makes its own arrangements. Not every applicant will be offered an interview

Please note:

- by participating in the match, you are acknowledging that the results of the match are binding
- the centralised match is for full time positions. Part-time and job-share positions may be negotiated before the match. If you secure a position, you must withdraw from the match. If you have not secured a position, you may enter the match for a full-time position
- Entering the match does not guarantee employment or ongoing training. The match is competitive. You are encouraged to apply widely.

More information about the match, including all dates, the rules of the match, and code of conduct can be found on the VGMT and PMCV websites. The Centralised Match will be a topic for discussion at the VGMT Training Day on 2nd June.
